African American Studies, Graduate Certificate

Requirements

The graduate Certificate in African American Studies requires a least 12 s.h. of credit. Students must maintain a gradepoint average of at least 2.75 in work for the certificate. With civil and corporate work environments taking a distinct interest in the diversity of people, training, and ideas within their respective environments, the certificate provides a means of formally acknowledging cultural and intellectual understanding that is being sought by potential employers.

Students must be enrolled in a graduate degree program of study to earn the certificate. They meet yearly with the certificate advisor to plan their certificate coursework.

The Certificate in African American Studies requires the following work.
