

Public Policy, Minor

The public policy minor is intended for University of Iowa undergraduate students who seek to understand how and why public policies are adopted; how they impact the economy, society, and communities; and how innovative public policies are developed to improve economic prosperity, wellbeing, and environmental sustainability at the local, state, national, and global levels.

The minor in public policy is well-suited for students studying economics, political science, education, sociology, criminology, pre-law, human rights, social work, geographical and sustainability science, environmental policy and planning, civil and environmental engineering, health and human physiology, public health, business, anthropology, history, journalism and mass communication, African American studies, and Native American and Indigenous studies among other areas.

Students completing the public policy minor will be able to analyze the impact of past and current public policies, understand the institutions and process of policymaking, and develop new public policies to tackle pressing challenges society faces. They will be prepared to enter policymaking fields in their areas of interest and to make communities, states, and nations more resilient, inclusive, and prosperous.

Requirements

The undergraduate minor in public policy requires 15 s.h. of coursework taken at the University of Iowa. Students must maintain a grade-point average of at least 3.00 in work for the minor. Coursework in the minor may not be taken pass/nonpass.
