

Master of Physician Associate Studies, MPA

The Master of Physician Associate Studies (MPA) program emphasizes education through the 16-month didactic education phase and the 12-month clinical phase that focuses on the traditional seven core clinical rotations. It also offers elective clinical rotations in selected medical subspecialties.

Students who complete the program are eligible to take the Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination (PANCE), which they must complete successfully in order to register as physician assistants in the United States.

The Department of Physician Associate Studies and Services is accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant and is a member of the Physician Assistant Education Association.
