- a Approved majors for the second degree include a BA in biology, a BS in biology, a BA in chemistry, a BS in chemistry, a BA in earth and environmental sciences, a BS in earth and environmental sciences, a BA in geographical and sustainability sciences, a BS in geographical and sustainability sciences, a BA in physics, a BS in physics, or a BS in science studies.
- b Sustainability must be completed by choosing a course that has been approved for Sustainability AND for one of these General Education areas: Natural Sciences; Quantitative or Formal Reasoning; Social Sciences; Historical Perspectives; International and Global Issues; Literary, Visual, and Performing Arts; or Values and Society.
- c Students who have completed four levels of a single language or two levels of two different languages in high school or college have satisfied the GE CLAS Core World Languages requirement. Students who have completed three levels of a single language may complete a fourth-level course in the same language or may choose an approved World Language and Cultural Exploration course. Enrollment in world languages courses requires a placement exam, unless enrolling in a first-semester-level course. Contact your academic advisor or CLAS Undergraduate Programs Office with questions concerning the World Languages requirement.
