a Courses for the Certificate in Human Rights may be taken in any order. With the exception of HRTS:2115 Introduction to Human Rights and HRTS:3905 Topics in Human Rights, most courses are only offered one semester each year.

b Complete a total of 6 s.h. Contemporary Global Issues in Human Rights courses by taking HRTS:3906 (typically offered in the fall) and/or HRTS:3905 which covers a broad range of topics and is repeatable. Students are encouraged to take HRTS:3905 for 1-2 s.h. at a time for several semesters.

c Complete the 3 s.h. Human Rights in Practice requirement by taking HRTS:3910 (typically offered in the fall) or HRTS:3920 (typically offered in the spring).
