

Inclusive Recreation, Minor

Requirements

The undergraduate minor in inclusive recreation requires a minimum of 15 s.h., including at least 12 s.h. taken at the University of Iowa in courses offered by the Department of Health, Sport, and Human Physiology. Students must maintain a grade-point average of at least 2.00 in all courses for the minor and in all UI courses for the minor. Coursework in the minor may not be taken pass/non-pass. CLAS minors may only be earned concurrent with or subsequent to earning a University of Iowa bachelor's degree. They cannot be granted as standalone credentials or as the sole program of study completed at the University of Iowa.

Students who earn a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in therapeutic recreation, either the inclusive recreation track or National Council on Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) track, may not earn the minor in inclusive recreation. Students who earn the Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in health studies may not earn the minor in inclusive recreation.

For the minor, students complete required courses that focus on various populations and interventions to promote inclusive recreation and participation in leisure.

The minor in inclusive recreation requires the following coursework.
